PhD Programme

The Centre offers one of the few doctoral programmes in Europe with a focus on Higher Education Internationalisation. Students are required to attend two research seminars a year, conduct original research and write a dissertation in English, supervised by international scholars and experts in the field.

PhD Research Seminar

Held twice a year, this five-day seminar is aimed at a broad community of aspiring or current PhD students, international education practitioners and senior scholars. Workshops and seminars on key and emerging issues are held by core and affiliated faculty, and invited academics. At the same time it provides a forum for participants to present and discuss their research with peers and experts.

Current International Research and Training Projects

Erasmus+ Projects

RIESAL – a collaboration between Europe and Latin America for the development of an online diploma programme in internationalisation and the publication of new materials. CHEI is involved in webinars, on-line modules and publications.

SUCTI – a European project, focusing on the development of training in internationalisation for administrative staff in higher education. CHEI led the mapping project on the current state of training in Europe and a Università Cattolica team has now been trained to deliver workshops for administrative staff.

FORINT – a training project on internationalisation of higher education in Cuba and Panama. CHEI has led the initial mapping exercise and is involved in training throughout the project.

IMPALA – a project involving 9 countries and 19 partners that aims to improve quality of HE in Latin American institutions by fostering an impact-driven culture and improving their responsiveness to needs in their local environment.

PROGRAMA DE INTERCAMBIO DE EXPERTOS CUBA

This is the second phase of a European Union programme for the modernisation of Cuba, focussing on higher education engagement and based on training and capacity building activities related to internationalisation, university leadership and management education.

Internationalising the Classroom and English-medium Instruction (EMI)

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

As part of the mission of the Centre, we provide professional development modules designed to support Università Cattolica academic staff teaching international classes in English. The workshops deal with approaches, strategies and skills for the international classroom, including feedback and assessment.

INTERNATIONAL SYMPOSIA AND SEMINARS

We hold regular events on internationalising the classroom and the use of English-medium instruction aimed at practitioners in the field, academics and researchers.

RESEARCH

Our affiliated faculty carry out research into the delivery of courses in English with a focus on Italian institutions, present at international conferences and publish in national and international journals.
