Programme information

Thank you for signing up to the CHEI research seminar on internationalisation of higher education from 5th to 9th September at the Università Cattolica del Sacro Cuore, Milan, Italy. This seminar has attracted an international mix of current and prospective CHEI doctoral students as well as at doctoral students enrolled in other programmes with an interest in internationalisation of higher education. You will find an interesting group of old and new faces!

Monday will start with a newcomers' session for those participants interested in learning about the CHEI PhD programme. **Monday afternoon** will be a workshop on how to make academic presentations by Amanda Murphy and will help participants prepare for the presentation of their work later in the week. Those participants who already feel comfortable with making presentations need not attend.

The first session on **Tuesday morning** will focus on how to write your research methods chapter with Fiona Hunter and is aimed mainly at participants who are still in the stages of planning this chapter but will also act as a useful checklist for those who are more advanced. This will be set within the context of writing your PhD and will also review the main elements of the Literature Review Chapter which we looked at last time.

Tuesday afternoon and **Wednesday** will be the Research Methods workshop entitled "Your research project from start to finish" with John Dennis. Using real data gathered on a recent project the workshop will explore how to design your research project, how to collect and analyse the data. Part of the workshop will be dedicated to showing participants how to use Qualtrics software for online data collection.

Thursday and **Friday** will be a mixture of presentations by Hans de Wit, Betty Leask and Chris Ziguras in plenary sessions and participant presentations in smaller groups which will be led by Hans de Wit, Betty Leask, Elspeth Jones, Chris Ziguras, John Dennis and Fiona Hunter. **Thursday evening** will be the CHEI dinner for all participants and we will end the seminar on Friday with a round table discussion on internationalisation with all our speakers and participants.



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Instructions for presentation sessions.

There will be three parallel sessions each led by two researchers. Each session lasts 90 minutes and each participant has a 45-minute slot. The purpose of this session is to help you advance your research project, at whatever stage, and therefore you should structure your presentation in a way that provides your audience with sufficient information to understand the questions you are asking at the end in order to receive their input.

You should plan an initial presentation of maximum 10 minutes and we have organised a special session at the beginning of the week to help you do this. The rest of the time should be used for interaction and discussion with the group. Please do not feel concerned if this is your first time. Everybody is at different stages and the purpose of the session is to help you take your research project to the next stage, even if it is only a vague notion in your head at the moment!

*Please note there are no organised “clinics” in this seminar as participants will be working in smaller groups and with more time assigned for their presentations. Participants wishing to talk to the academic staff present should contact them directly to arrange meetings outside the programme schedule (coffee or lunch breaks or at the end of day).

CHEI PhD students have a session with the CHEI Director Amanda Murphy and a library visit will also be organised in one of the lunchtime slots. CHEI PhD students will be contacted to define their meeting and library times.
