Simon Schwarzfuchs, *Le pèlerinage dans l'expérience des Juifs des temps modernes*

Simon Schwarzfuchs is French born in Alsace. After the war studied at the Ecole Rabbinique in Paris, the Sorbonne and the E.P.H.E. religious sciences section. Ph.D. at Dropsie College in 1953. Returned to France and specialized in medieval Jewish History in Western Europe and French speaking countries. Taught at the Ecole Rabbinique and the sixth section of the E.P.H.E. In Israel since 1964. Taught at Bar Ilan University until retirement in 1995.

The contribution is an attempt to describe the fate of Jewish pilgrimages in Europe in the wake of the Shoah and the dispersion of the survivors, which put an end to many of these traditional popular meetings. It also tries to describe the new pilgrimages which emerged in this period.
