The transition from manuscript to print culture brought a transfer of the written heritage from one technology to another, defined new rules in the transmission of knowledge and gave birth to new forms of communication. Among the first to deal with this reality, the institutional authorities had to adapt themselves to this new technology in order to properly spread their legal advertisements, both through the familiar book formats and the production of broadsheets, edicts and proclamations.

The international conference *With the Pen and the Press. The Production and Dissemination of Normative Texts of Cities and Princes in Northern-Central Italy during the Early Modern Age* is intended to be a moment of reflection on the production, uses, and conservation of normative texts. The event is funded by the Catholic University of Milan, inside the PRIN project *The Dawn of Italian Printing. Technology, Texts and Books in Central and Northern Italy in the Fifteenth and Sixteenth Centuries*, and it will be broadcast in live streaming on the afternoon of Monday 14th December 2020 and the morning of Tuesday 15th December on the [Facebook page of the State Archive of Milan](#) and on the [YouTube channel of CRELEB – “Il canale dei libri”](#).

The rich geopolitical landscape of northern-central Italy represents a privileged context to observe closely how the printing presses actively entered into the construction of the identity and political discourse of Renaissance dukedoms, principates and republics. In this context, the wide range of problems and open questions allows us to approach the subject from perspectives related to the history of the book and even to the history of institutions.
